First Baptist Church, Highland, IL burned their mortgage on Sunday, January 21, 2018. This mortgage came about when the previous church building was destroyed by fire. This year will be the 20th anniversary of the new building. The following is a portion of a note of reflection by **Pastor Rob Kirbach**. *“Today’s mortgage burning symbolizes more to me than a financial milestone. As I lit that paper, watching it become consumed by fire in the same manner as the church building that preceded it, I saw the culmination of a determined and resilient people whose faith was strengthened by adversity. The warmth of those little flames this morning remind me of the warm generosity and compassion this congregation has become known for. And seeing the charred remains of that promissory note make me think of a future yet to be written. Today’s mortgage burning marks the beginning of a new era for FBC Highland. The future of this congregation looks exciting, indeed.*
