#### A WORD FROM THE EXECUTIVE MINISTER, REV. PATTY BILYEU

I just returned from San Juan, Puerto Rico, where I attended the American Baptist Churches USA Biennial Mission Summit. I always love attending these gatherings when I can, to celebrate the shared ministry as pastors, church leaders, and denomination leaders connect with one another in our partnership to spread the good news of Jesus Christ. It was a very rewarding time celebrating the richness of our diversity. Women and men, preachers and teachers, and leaders of multiethnic backgrounds were all reflected in the worship and in workshops. General Secretary, The Rev. Dr. C. Jeff Woods, said in his opening statement, "It is so enriching to see the American Baptist family gathered in Puerto Rico for the first in-person Biennial in four years. The reach of American Baptist Mission is incredible, and it is even more evident when the family is gathered in the same place, sharing with one another."

One highlight, too, was to see GRR's own, Dr. Jim Wolfe, on stage and around the biennial as the President of ABCUSA. 1 Timothy 4:12 (NLT) 12 Don't let anyone think less of you because you are young. Be an example to all believers in what you say, in the way you live, in your love, your faith, and your purity. Trailblazing for the cause of Church Revitalization: Patty King on God's Work Today

In a suburb of Toledo Ohio, Patty King was born on a Monday and was in Church the next Sunday. Raised in a Church that invited people to follow the call of God in their lives, she never knew women could be Pastors. And by the time she was graduating high school, she knew she could preach, too. "Patty King" her pastor had said to her one day after she preached in her Church, "if there is anyone who should attend seminary it's you!"

It was only in 1990 while pursuing at MDiv at Northern Seminary when her eyes were opened to the wider issue of how many women struggle to be affirmed in ministry. Along with several other women, however, she found a safe harbor to grow into the leader and pastor God called her to be. She became a pastor and spent significant time in youth ministry.

Today, Patty is the Executive Minister of the Great Rivers Region of the American Baptist Churches USA, a region made up of 205 Churches. She is trailblazing her way as the first woman to hold Executive Minister. Patty's passion? Church revitalization. In her role, she is seeing Churches that were once on the verge of closing now minister and care in ways that are new and necessary. "One Church in our region is ministering to people who are assimilating – those coming out of prison and former drug addicts." She says, "The Church looks totally different, but it has come back to life. It is amazing."

Her conclusion as she reflects on what God is doing today? "God is already working, and if we look closely, we can partner with him to transform the world." Men and women, together.
